There is a new program that Chippewa Lake recently joined through the Ohio Treasurer of State's Office (TOS).

What this program will soon offer all residents, and anyone else in the entire country, is a "view only" capability of every payment made by the Village since 2013. This way our residents can see where every tax dollar is going for maintenance, operating costs, salaries, utilities, snow plowing, mowing, etc.

The Village is now working with the TOS as we finalize all details and by the end of next week we hope to have all payments entered from 01/01/2013 through 09/30/2018. The plan is to upload each month's payments by the 15th day of the following month going forward.

We plan on having a link on the Village website very soon making it easier for all residents to access this information.

We also know that the majority of our citizens have real concerns with this ongoing issue. We believe this hard working group of fellow residents has already made a difference and will continue to do so.
