Save the date! October 24th Chippewa Lake Ohio Historical Society Meeting--

Chippewa Lake Historical Society welcomes "the first female candidate for President".

Kathy Kraus will portray Victoria C. Woodhull, the first woman to run for president of the United States at the Chippewa Lake Ohio Historical Society's Oct. 24 meeting.

Woodhull, an Ohioan, was one of the most controversial figures of her time. She received little formal education, worked as a traveling clairvoyant, was the first female broker on Wall Street, the first woman to address a congressional committee, founded a weekly newspaper with platforms for feminism and controversial subjects of the day and spent Election Day in jail. She was a leader in the women's suffrage movement and in 1872 she ran for president.

The meeting begins at 7 p.m. at the Chippewa Lake Community Center, 24 Circle Crest Drive, and is open to the public. A brief business meeting will precede Kraus's presentation.
