EMERGENCY WEATHER UPDATES

Chippewa Lake Residents,

This past Saturday, June 6 at noon, you may have heard the Warning Siren from Fire Station #2. The first Saturday of the month is the test for emergency sirens throughout Medina County. Unfortunately, the Chippewa Lake siren has been dormant for several months as State-wide emergency communications are undergoing a technology change. We have been working thru various radio frequency issues to keep this siren active and up to date with new communication technologies being implemented. Stay tuned as this may take several months to fully implement and some additional adjustments to our siren will be necessary. Also, for those concerned citizens that wish to be up to date with the various Emergency Alerts communications here are a few suggestions for you to explore.

- 3. From the various weather app options for your cell phones there are several emergency alerts options. Many choices to choose from but here are some of the more popular .coms if you are not up to speed on the various weather options available to you.

LAKE SAFETY

The Medina County Park District Rangers can be reached through the Medina Sheriff Dispatch phone number, 330-725-6631. If you have concerns about safe operation of watercraft, this is the number to call. They have also addressed issues of excessive engine noise, and removed boats from the lake, as there are regulations about this, too.

MOSQUITO SPRAYING

Currently, mosquito spraying in the Village happens on Thursday night. If West Nile is detected in the area (or if there is an influx of bugs), spraying will be added on Monday nights. Information is on the Village website about the chemicals solutions being used.
