We are happy to announce resumption of our regular meetings beginning on June 23 at 7 p.m. Please join us as we hear the true story of noted barnstormer Ralph Wensinger, who, while entertaining thousands of spectators at Chippewa Lake Park in September 1933, crashed his bi-plane into the lake, losing his life and that of his co-pilot Samual Versaci.

Cleveland researcher Rosey Sanchez, accompanied by Wensinger's great-nephew, will offer the fascinating story following a brief business meeting, to be held at the Chippewa Lake Community Center, 24 Circle Crest Drive, Chippewa Lake. All our meetings are open to the public. The building is handicap accessible. Please join us.
