### **THE TENNIS COURT STORY**

Over the years, many interim solutions were tried to try to keep the tennis courts usable. Finally a year ago, it was determined that a complete renovation was necessary for the 100 year old courts. With funds in short supply, and a quote for resurfacing at \$80k (with no guarantee for cracking), it seemed hopeless.

With diligent research and coordination by John Sandora, a new and innovative modular tile product at half the cost and with a 16 year guarantee, was found. In addition, a local family donated their tennis court fencing. That exact fencing is being installed now; the new surface will be installed shortly thereafter, and final finishes will complete the project.

The costs for this project have been generously paid for by an endowment from Sid and Doris Auble.
