## MEDINA OFFERS STORM WEARY FOLKS IN NORTH CAROLINA "PROMISE OF CHRISTMAS "

Downtown Medina will recreate a Christmas glow for those who are weary and struggling to overcome the tragedies of multiple storms and floods. During January 10-12, downtown Medina with the support of Castle Noel, Main Street Medina, and many others, join to provide a festive weekend.

The North Carolina residents will arrive on a Friday and be treated to dinner at a Medina County barn turned wedding venue then enjoy a live show that night.

They will stay in hotels in Medina .

And on Saturday, they will spend most of the day in the square, where they will enjoy free meals, tour Castle Noel and see a show . That evening, the city plans to recreate its popular Candlelight Walk for just one night on Jan. 11.

The <u>Medina Auto Mall</u> is contributing \$20,000 toward the effort and a fire extinguisher company in California is covering the cost of the fireworks.

Like the city's popular event that is typically held the weekend before Thanksgiving, this one-night condensed version will feature luminaries around the historic square,

entertainment, live reindeer and ice carving, along with a Christmas parade that will step off at 6 p.m. and end with a fireworks display over the historic courthouse.

The important thing — aside from seeking donations to help cover some of the expense — is for northern Ohio residents to show up on Saturday night in Christmas sweaters to join in the festivities, said Jody Robbins, executive director of the Medina County Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Robbins said Northeast Ohio residents should bring their "smiles" to Medina's square on Jan. 11 and help provide the perfect backdrop for the festive escape for these visitors from North Carolina.
