While researching information for Arcadia Publishing’s Images of America series, Amber Dalakas, Sharon Karhan and Gayle Foster, authors of 2017’s Chippewa Lake, received a contribution of photos and other memorabilia from the estate of Parker Beach, owner of Chippewa Lake Park during its heyday period including the 1940’s through the 1960’s.

Included in the collection were two tins of 16mm films never before seen. Beach’s granddaughter, who sent the package, said she had no idea what was on the films, but she didn’t care to have them back.

Those films have been converted to a digital format and will be shown to the public on Wed. July 18 at a fundraiser for the Chippewa Lake Historical Society at the Oaks Lakeside restaurant at Chippewa in conjunction with a picnic-style pork sandwich barbeque dinner prepared by chefs from the Oaks.

The event will begin with cocktails at 7, dinner at 8 and the movie, to be shown on an inflatable outdoor screen at 9:30. Tickets, at \$25 each, are limited and being sold in advance through historical society board members or by calling 330-725-8169.

Of special interest, along with other “movie” snacks, an outdoor concession stand will feature cotton candy made on the original machine used at the former amusement park. The Chippewa Lake Historical Society, founded in 2015, has a mission to educate and foster appreciation of the Chippewa Lake area and its history. Serving current and future generations, it collects, shares, catalogues and preserves artifacts, documents and images unique to the culture and history of the Chippewa Lake area, villages, cottage communities, Native American presence and Chippewa Lake Park.

Fundraising efforts are underway to one day obtain a “home” to store and display those items as they are received.
